Whereasthe proportions of Underserved Students is (st-Generation Underrepresented Minority, and or Low-Income) students has decreased in the Cohen Honors College in recent years, the Honors College Student Counailms to increase diversity within the college. This fits in with the goals of Wichita State University and the lusive excellence strategic plan for past and coming Academic Years.

The percentage of Underrepresented Minorities in the college from 220172 was 29% and dropped to 25% in 2018 propared to the University for the same time per 2011 and 39.7% respectively

The percentage of FirGereration students in the college from 202044-8 was 29.6% compared to the University's 41%.

The proportion of Underserved Applicants to the Honors College has decreased from 50.4% in 2014 to 36.1% in 2018.

Therefore, the Honors College Student Council recommends amending the bylaws to remove the GPA and ACTSAT requirement from the application. The second with the trend of colleges and universities including the University of Southern California, recognizing that a higher socioeconomic status is the greatest predictor of high standardized test scores.

It has been noted the exceptions esaportion of the application where students explain their reasons for not meeting the GPA and ACT/SAT requirent, can drive otherwise qualified students from applying.

College also has no minimum requirement; they focus on distinicites.

Removing the barriers of GPA and ACT/SAT requirements will increase the diversity of applicants to the college, as shown in a study by Syverson, Franks, and Hiss (2018). Moreover, the Student Council hopes to create an environ meditculture the Honors College that values experiences and effort rather than only numblesCohen Honors Collegegoal to enhance the intellectual, professional, innovative, and transformative ethics of its members which cannot be measured by numbers.

Therefore, we recommend that application process can be more holistic, considering all factors of a student's high school and transfer experiences, as well as GPA as a school and transfer experiences.
