"It would be my preference that course is repeatable. Students do go to different locations and then the course content is of course very different. However, Id make the argument that even going to the same destination brings enough difference. I switch out most, if not all of the course readings, use different reflective prompts for theirgoning blog, and change out the final project (this year was an a installation photo voice project, last year a final presentation as a part of an open showcase). Additionally, this year students competed in the Service Showcase in groups of 5-6 students which was a new addition to the cotinsely, the overarching theme evolves (last year Start Something That Matters was used, this year we explored personal privilege as a way of understanding systematic issues related to the immersive service work).
