WSU Admission Requirements
If you are a transfer student with 24 credit hours or more, you must: Have a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA (on a 4.00 scale) on all previous college work. If you are a transfer student under age 21, with fewer than 24 credit hours, you must: Have a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA (on a 4.00 scale on all previous college work and meet the freshman requirements. Some academic colleges at WSU have an additional higher transfer GPA requirement for admission. Visit <https://www.wichita.edu/admissions/undergraduate/qa.php>

WSU Transfer Credit Acceptance
It is the policy of WSU to accept all credits with the exception of remedial coursework earned at a post-secondary institution accredited by one of the U.S. regional accrediting agencies. Each academic college or department within WSU determines how those credits apply toward a particular degree program. Sometimes there can be a significant difference between what transfers and what counts toward a degree, especially if the courses are vocational in nature.

Graduation Requirements
To qualify for graduation with a WSU degree, students must meet certain requirements such as course credit hours, levels, GPA, and residency. The following prerequisites must be met in order to enroll in upper-division courses in the W. Frank Barton School of Business:
É Declared major in the W. Frank Barton School of Business
É 60 hours; 2.25 GPA

NOTE:
• (L) - indicates that the course is a WSU equivalent course. The name indicates that the WSU equivalent course is a 200-level course.

Effective Fall 2024, WSU will follow the KBOR system-wide GE program framework which is comprised of 34-35 credit hours organized in six discipline-designated buckets. A student who satisfies all seven buckets will complete the GE program.

- The 34-35 credit hours are divided as follows:
- 3 English Discipline Area - Bucket 1: ENGL 0101 and ENGL 0102.
 - 3 Communications Discipline Area - Bucket 2: SPCH 0151.
 - 3 Mathematics & Statistics Discipline Area - Bucket 3: One listed course.
 - 3 Natural & Physical Science Discipline Area - Bucket 4: Four to Five hours and must include a lab. Choose one of the listed courses.
 - 3 Social & Behavioral Science Discipline Area - Bucket 5: Two hours. Choose one of the listed courses.
