- Appropriate uses of funds include, but are not limited to, purchasing data or other information necessary for research, funding student assistants who will participate in the research project (strongly encouraged), travel that is closely related to the project, and modest stipends for researchers.
- Recipients will be expected to present their research at an appropriate forum on the Wichita State campus, before policymakers in Kansas, or at another forum that is consistent with the ISEG mission.
